PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Beutler, could you please check in? Authorized...call-in votes have been accepted. Voting on the Wickersham amendment.

ASSISTANT CLERK: Senator Connealy voting no. Senator Thompson voting no. Senator Suttle voting no. Senator Bromm voting yes. Senator Jones voting yes. Senator Dierks voting yes. Senator Janssen voting yes. Senator Redfield voting yes. Senator Robak voting yes. Senator Brown voting no. Senator Hudkins voting yes. Senator Bohlke voting yes. Senator Bruning voting yes. Senator Price voting yes. Senator Dickey voting yes.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Wickersham.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Mr. President, this is becoming a little bit difficult. Could we just have a roll call? Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Roll call vote has been requested. Senator Price, could you check in, please? Senator...Senator Robak, could you check in, please? Mr. Clerk, when you're ready, please call the roll.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Roll call vote taken, Legislative Journal page 1486.) The vote is 25 ayes, 16 nays on the adoption of Senator Wickersham's amendment.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: The amendment is agreed to. Mr. Clerk, next item on the bill. The call is raised.
