addition to the fact that Senator Landis probably would have thrown himself on something sharp if I had not, is that the fiscal note, just for the tiered part of this, which to me is the...the...is the...a very simple part. As I will reiterate, we're not even having reimbursement followed the tiered piece of it. This is just a method to let the consumer, the parent, know what...what kind of quality is involved in this program. That...that part had a fiscal note that I thought was just absolutely outrageous, including the hiring of attorneys. I guess if somebody applies for this and this...it would be...the situation would be that the individual who wishes to fall under either the Tier II or Tier III level would apply for that and have to provide documentation about why they meet those, those levels. In the Tier III level that would be a document from a nationally recognized or state recognized accrediting...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR BROWN: ...organization that said that they were accredited. It's pretty simple and...and it would seem that it would meet, because accreditation levels or standards are so high that it would very clearly meet our standards in terms of minimum licensing, that there would be actually less work. But the department felt that it would require a number of individuals to do further compliance and even cited previous legislation that we have passed as part of the justification, which I don't think that there should be a relationship. But I will turn on my light and see if anybody else wants to speak to this and then I will pull the amendment. Thank you.
