no persuading him. He's a lost cause on this thing. So I'm going to be voting against the Wickersham amendments, but I think Senator Chambers has pretty well framed the issue, as has Senator Wickersham. Does LB 925 survive to go to Select File for an attempt to refine it, adjust language, with LB 914 or without? The Raikes amendment is up next. I'm going to withdraw mine. Senator Wickersham has another one of his floor amendments that's going to write my bill for me on definitions, and then he's got LB 914 or LB 925. That's the real issue. I'd suggest we get there and see where the chips fall. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Landis. Senator Raikes, your light is on last. You can use this for your close if you would like.

SENATOR RAIKES: Thank you, Mr. Lieutenant Governor, members. I would ask that this amendment be withdrawn.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: The amendment is withdrawn. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment, Senator Landis, AM3225.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Landis.
