those. The University of Nebraska was late in...for two things. They were late in recognizing their costs, and their costs hit a little bit later. They had a fairly good-sized pool in their health care trust fund but we did fund the state of Nebraska, we did fund state colleges, and we have felt it fair to this point to fund the University of Nebraska in their increasing health care costs. So that was part of our rationale in this. We do...there is a study that they are having ongoing that will be brought to our attention in more detail next year. I think we recognize that next year there will be more, but this we considered something that is necessary for them to keep moving and so they do not run down to a very severe deficit a year from now if we don't do this. And either if we do this or whether we don't do this, I think we stand a very high risk of having an early deficit next year to cover this...this potential cost because it is...they are experiencing high health care costs and health insurance rates just...they are self-insured but like all the rest of us in all of the areas of government, so we did recommend a \$1,250,000 restoration in this year. And we actually had cut back from what they'd recommended. Their original request was \$8.5 million. The Governor cut that back to 4. We increased that to \$6 million. At this point, they are not at even our full \$6 million because of the lack of funding that second year which is the next year, but we feel that that is something that ought to be considered. One other thing I will say on the Centennial Mall, I know others will speak on these, the state of Nebraska has about 32 percent of that area that is covered in the two blocks north of the Capitol. That is the rationale for feeling that we have some obligation there, and I realize that is a matter of opinion to some too. Fifty-seven percent of that total area is government, either federal or state, and we have felt at...or, let's see, got the other one, 32 percent state, 11 percent city, and 14 percent federal, so we felt we did have some obligation in this area to cover that amount of frontage that we have in that area, and it's generally felt by the committee this \$500,000 would represent all that we're going to be willing to put into that in the foreseeable future. So with that, that's a fairly thumbnail sketch of what our reasons for the overriding of this particular amount of package for your consideration. I will answer questions and I know others want to perhaps speak on this. Thank you.
