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granite, and I...I say that with affection, I used to serve there, if the nine blocks of granite are leading us toward, where will we be in relationship to the rest of the A bills?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I don't have the number, Senator Brashear. Oh, now I do.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: It's a great staff, isn't it?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes. If we would override today with this package, there would be...we would be \$18 million above minimum reserve in the current...no, excuse me, that's 18 without...just overriding today would be \$18 million this biennium and \$9 million in the out biennium. If all Select...if Select File and the E & R Initial bills were to pass, we would be \$7 million below the line this year, and in the out year it's \$49 million below the line.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Well, Senator Wehrbein, if I might ask, then where are we going? I mean oftentimes we find in the legislative process that we...the sequencing and the prioritization of that which we do affects where we're going, so where are we going with all of the A bills that are on Select File and all of the things that we have not yet treated in final form?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Well, those are...

SENATOR BRASHEAR: We've already put \$55 million out in property tax relief, right?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes. Those are decisions yet to be made, Senator Brashear. It's not a...it's not a clear-cut subject. Obviously, even before we...even when we came here this morning with the vetoes, we were going to be below the line and the body will have to decide in the remaining bills we have whether we're going to have them or not, I guess, and I'll speak frankly, maybe some are counting on increased revenue. I don't know...

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: One minute.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: ...what all the ramifications are. The
