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SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Yes.

SENATOR CROSBY: So am I about out?

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Pretty close.

SENATOR CROSBY: I want...I will say very quickly and then I'll speak again, I am the one who brought this legislation. I read in the newspaper this problem last summer, in 1999, summer of 1999. I am the one. The university did not come to me.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Time.

SENATOR CROSBY: So I want you to understand that and I'll talk some more when my light comes up again. Thank you.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Raikes.

SENATOR RAIKES: Thank you, Mr. Speaker and members. Senator Wehrbein, if I could, I'd like to ask you a couple of questions.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Wehrbein, would you respond?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.

SENATOR RAIKES: I'm looking at the second page of the...actually it's today's agenda, and I noticed that you've got on there six numbers that are enclosed in boxes. I assume they are enclosed in boxes because they are particularly important numbers, is that right?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.

SENATOR RAIKES: And if I understand it correctly, the bottom two numbers reflect the amount of money that would be in excess of or short of the minimum required reserve if all bills that are now on Select and Final pass?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.

SENATOR RAIKES: Okay.
