reserve, and I might have said minus seven. So I decided to pass it out and let you look at those numbers yourself. And it's true, we'd still be \$49 million in the out years, three years hence, too, if we would carry on, and I want to say that we made this decision in recent times, and we've had lots of discussion about what those out years should be, what revenue sources you use, what the state of the economy is going to be. Lots of factors go into that, actually, the size of the property tax relief package; as you recall, the size of the cash reserve. We have the, and I guess if I can get philosophical, some of the decisions we make, as the Appropriations Committee, is what is proper for the state of Nebraska, and I've made this statement in public several times already. What commitment do you have to Sheldon Art Gallery? What commitment do you have to the State Historical Society? Many of the...the State Historical Society is well over 100 years old, we put some planning money into that, but that's another \$4 million down the road. We probably are going to have to get to finding out what traditional things that Nebraska has had, are we going to continue...focus on versus what are we going to do new? And you'll find in some of the discussions I've had, which I got even last week, are some new spending programs. If we take on new spending programs, we are gradually going to have to get rid of old things, and that may well include the State Historical Society. I am not...I am not making threats and I'm not predicting that, I don't want anyone to overreact to that.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: One minute.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: But we may have to make those decisions if we take on new spending programs, and so this, today, is an acknowledgement that the Sheldon Art Gallery is important. And if we keep delaying this, for example, then we have to decide in a couple of years how really important is it, or the State Historical Society, which has a similar heating and air conditioning problem. Now, we've made some commitment to that, and we have a programming study so that that...but that will be on our table next year. It shows that how serious that \$60 million we had in child health care and...child care was in this year's budget, and we have voted not to change that, and most of us are predicting that is going to continue to grow.
