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bit when we look at...we argue about keeping funding in the budget three years from now. We'll be back next year to do it all over again, and with that in mind, I have difficulty supporting any of the overrides. Thank you.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Jones.

SENATOR JONES: Mr. President, members of the body, this is kind of an interesting package that we got put together. Everybody wants to support one thing or another and none of us want to support them all, so it's kind of confusing. And so I'm not going to support the override, and there might be something come up after as an amendment that I could support. I just don't know yet. But, anyway, I wanted to ask Senator Wehrbein a couple of questions, if I might.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Wehrbein, will you respond?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.

SENATOR JONES: Yes, I want to talk about UN health costs just a little bit, is this amount you're trying to override, what is the full amount that they use for that, do you know?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: No, I don't know the total. I don't know, this is the deficit request so I don't...I don't have...I can get that.

SENATOR JONES: Well, yeah, I understand it's a deficit request. I just thought maybe you had the full amount, and how fast has that been increasing. I know it increases for all of us in our operations.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Well, they are self-insured and they had a very good reserve pool a year...a few years ago. They had an unusual high amount of drawdown in the last couple of years. Claims, insurance claims is part of it, which I think is probably industrywide, as far as that's concerned. But because they were self-insured, it hits them directly and a year ago in June is when this was discovered when we were out of session. And so there was not...we didn't...probably should have faced it a year ago when we were here and we didn't know it. We didn't
