SENATOR JONES: Right.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: ...and then if you...as that dropped, so it's in the neighborhood of 160 to 170 million.

SENATOR JONES: So you got a 3.38 percent right below that, so that is what the \$18 million represents.

SENATOR JONES: Okay, and the \$18 million just represents the 38...
