SENATOR JENSEN: No.

SENATOR HILGERT: So we knew that this was going to be forgiven?

SENATOR JENSEN: No, we did not know it was going to be forgiven.

SENATOR HILGERT: So we were just going to be left in a lurch.

SENATOR JENSEN: We would have been that much short on future funding, yes.

SENATOR HILGERT: Okay. Thank you, Senator Jensen. I certainly support this line-item override, as well as the subsequent one. Thank you.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, this is an item that I will support in terms of a vote to override. We are in the last seven days now and, as you all know, the prophets have all said, in the last days perilous times shall come. Perilous times are upon us and, as some of us scan the countryside, we look at what things are deemed important by the Legislature and, from my position, if something of this nature is not important I don't think anything left on the agenda is important. People have taken care of property and some of these other things. Perhaps if there had been more concern about the mentally ill Scott Baldwin, who used to play football for Nebraska, would not be paralyzed today as a result of a negligent gunshot by an Omaha police officer. There are prices to pay later when we don't take precautionary or preventative steps at the time that we should. To try to kind of give my position as I view it in the remaining days of the session, I will talk, Senator Aguilar, about an old fellow who was called John the Revelator. He is credited with having written a book in the Bible called "Revelations". Other call...others call it the "Apocalypse". There was one portion of it that spoke of four horses, but the part that has always impressed me was where he wrote: and I beheld a pale horse and
