SENATOR SCHMITT: But would that be figured into if this was leased for more than what would be generated? I guess that's where you lost me there somewhere because you got to be figuring the total amounts from this, even the administrative costs I think if we're talking about the amount that's going to be generated by the lease.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: That's correct. You take that into consideration, those expenses, right, similar as you would the money that's...the proceeds from the sale...

SENATOR SCHMITT: Right.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: ...also have to have an administrative cost. I'm trying to compare apples to apples by doing that.

SENATOR SCHMITT: I just wonder if there's, because the administrative costs seem to be the issue in the past on this when we even discussed selling this originally a few years back. I think that's what brought it about was the administration was eating up the dollars and so that's the reason I just wondered how this was all playing into the figure. Maybe I'll talk to you off of the floor here...

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Okay.

SENATOR SCHMITT: ...in just a little bit. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Schmitt. Senator Raikes, on the Bromm amendment.
