PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Time.

SENATOR LANDIS: ...the things I do think it needs to take into account is income that the center receives from employees are costs. That's reasonable. In other words, it needs to be a net idea. That...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Time.

SENATOR LANDIS: ...needs to be there and those are things...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator, your time is expired.

SENATOR LANDIS: ...I can do between now and Select File. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you. Senator Wickersham.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Do you need more time, David? I'll yield some. Yeah. Yeah.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: Thirty seconds to wrap up. There needs to be some language on this is...these are net expenses. I will tell you now I would try to expand the definition, but I want a chance to work on that language. I would try to work on the equality of the availability of this for all employees with some specific language, and generally I think we ought to treat this as a referendum on whether or not LB 925 has sort of the green light from the body to make it work, and if it doesn't get the green light that's where we'll be. I return the rest of the time to Senator Wickersham.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Wickersham.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Thank you, Mr. President. I think Senator Landis was very candid in talking about some of the difficulties with LB 925 as it currently stands, and I'm talking about the bill that came out of committee, not the bill as amended, although I think Senator Hilgert would also advise you that the amendment that was adopted concerning modifications of the time
