will be vetoed by the Governor, I think those of us who have an interest should do what we can to see whether either version of the bill can garner enough votes to survive a veto, or if retaining both propositions would bring together enough votes to survive a veto. This is the point in the session where we have to be very practical and, with those things having been said, I think I'll just sit back and listen, observe, and see what happens. SENATOR RAIKES: Thank you, Mr. Lieutenant Governor, members. I was going to comment on my deliberations as to whether to...to vote for this on to Select File. Senator Landis, in discussing what he might work on, mentioned quality, which I'm very interested in. He did not mention that...offering preschool or prekindergarten services. My desire or requirement, I guess you would say, is that in order for a business to receive credits or payments they would have to offer a quality program including preschool children. I think those are the real needs we have in the state and my suggestion would be that the credits that are now in the bill be reduced if, in fact, those requirements are not met. I would suggest that if you don't include the prekindergarten aspect of the program a measurement of quality becomes more difficult, because most accreditation programs, as I understand it, deal with preschool children, not with school-age children.
