CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, to place the house under call.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: The house is under call. Would unauthorized personnel please leave the floor. Would members please record your presence. The house is under call. Senator Baker, Senator Brashear. The house is under call. Would members please record their presence. Senator Engel, Senator Jones, the house is under call. Senator Jones, the house is under call. CLERK: 32 ayes, 11 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of LB 925.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: The bill is advanced and the call is raised. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: LB 925A, by Senator Landis. (Read title.)

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Landis, you're recognized to open.

SENATOR LANDIS: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I'd ask for the accompanying A bill to advance as well. By the way, the cost of the bill has been estimated by our two groups that do this at \$500,000 and \$3 million, which is why the A...why...which is why the fiscal note is a million eight. This is actually the costs of expenses to make that system work for the Revenue Department, so it's not a million eight appropriation by any means, and recall that for our expense purposes Senator Hilgert's bill or language saves us, we're told, about a million five. This is the costs of essentially getting the Revenue Department to be able to do this credit, but I do want to review for you what the fiscal note essentially would be. At this point, the fiscal note, with both parts of the bill, should read about \$300,000 a year for fiscal costs. This, however, are the expenses of the Revenue Department to reprogram their computer, and I'd ask for the advancement of LB 925A. Thank you.
