goal is not to make it convenient for lobbyists. If the reporting that they're required to do is too onerous, just let them stop putting on these...these feeds and the other things. This is not a favor to the lobbyists and I'm going to give an example when we get into a discussion of the amendment which is pending, after it's adopted, of how a lobbyist padded the account which was given to the principal and falsely reported that certain senators were being taken to affairs so that that money could go into the lobbyist's pocket. And since it didn't have to be reported anywhere by individual senators, the only way they knew is that the principal asked them had they gone to this many functions.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Chambers. For debate on AM3201, Senator Bromm.

SENATOR BROMM: Thank you, Lieutenant Governor. I also want to commend Senator Schimek, Senator Wickersham and others who worked on this, this amendment. I know it's difficult work. I think they did an outstanding job of trying to...to make it as clear as possible. Senator Chambers, I agree that this whole area needs clarification and could stand rewriting. That would be great and some of us would rather you do that than to fry our fish, you know? So give that some thought. But, in any event, I do have a couple of questions just for clarification that perhaps if Senator Schimek would yield to a question.

SENATOR BROMM: Senator Schimek, it's the bottom of page 2 of AM3201 and the top of page 3, which is probably referred to on the first page of your handout down towards the bottom right. We're talking about entertainment expenses and we're talking about a lobbyist reporting these items and it says on line 25: "the statement shall disclose the aggregate expenses for such entertainment," et cetera. Okay, a couple of questions there on what your intention is on "aggregate". And, once again, let's...let's think about the typical banquet that is held at the Cornhusker in connection with the annual convention of "XYZ" organization, and 20 senators go to that banquet but there are
