SENATOR THOMPSON: ...long before.

SENATOR THOMPSON: ...has a wedding, he has...does that person have to ask every person who gives him a gift if that amount is \$50?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: No. Well, I mean...

SENATOR THOMPSON: How would...I guess...
