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SENATOR THOMPSON: Okay. I just...I understand.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...the part that deals with gifts from other than lobbyists or principals.

SENATOR THOMPSON: Exactly.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: And one of the things that was required originally, or that some people wanted, was that the public would also have to report. Well, I think that's very difficult at best, that it would be difficult for the public to know they even had to report. So what we did is we eliminated that part of it. So there's really nothing to counteract your report, unless of course...

SENATOR THOMPSON: Okay.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...somebody goes and asks the person who gave you the gift if that's accurate.

SENATOR THOMPSON: Right. But you're dropping the amount, I guess is what I'm concerned about, to...from \$100 to \$50, correct?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Well, there is an amendment coming up later. I think we'll have a full discussion on that issue.

SENATOR THOMPSON: Okay. How much time do I have left, Mr. Chairman?

SENATOR CUDABACK: About five seconds, Senator.

SENATOR THOMPSON: Okay. I'll save my other question.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Thompson. Senator Kristensen, on the Wickersham amendment.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the Legislature. Senator Chambers, I'm going to preference (sic--preface) my remarks, and then I'm going to address some
