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your grandchildren. Ask yourself if you don't think that's the definition of "immediate family" that you have in your mind. My parents, maybe my grandparents, certainly my children, certainly my grandchildren, that's my immediate family. Maybe my brothers and sisters; are those people your immediate family? Not under the accountability law. Your immediate family, for purposes of the accountability law, is your spouse, thank goodness for that, and your children living in your home. Your spouse and your children living in your home are your immediate family for purposes of the accountability law; not your parents, not your grandparents, not your children that have grown up, thank goodness. It's only the children that are still in your house and your spouse. So when you see the language in the statutes that says immediate family, relatives, spouse, then that gives it a little broader scope. But you also need to be aware that the exception for gifts from an immediate family is not quite what you might think it is, and you need to be careful about that as well.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Wickersham. Senator Schimek on the Coordsen amendment, FA362. Senator Schimek, are you available?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Actually, I'm going to pass for a minute.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Coordsen, there are no further lights on. Senator Schimek, did you wish to...there are no further lights. Senator, did you wish to close on your amendment?

SENATOR COORDSEN: First of all, I would like to thank Senator Wickersham, because he made this amendment even more important. While he was speaking, we quickly got the sections of statute cited. And I apologize to the body for not noting them. But this section of law that we're proposing to modify with the Coordsen amendment is in fact that. It's much worse than I had even thought, that when your grown children give you a Christmas gift, and you would assume it to be, hope it to be more than \$50, because you gave them \$100 to buy it with (laughter), that...apparently some other people have grown children...in fact that would be something that would have to be reported. And I didn't know it was that restrictive, but it is exactly as Senator Wickersham described in 1423 and 49-1425. We may at
