SENATOR BEUTLER: Well, they...Lancaster County...you could not get them from Lancaster County and benefit from the exemption. If you got them from Lancaster County, assuming Lancaster County was a principal, then you'd be subject to the \$50 limitation.

SENATOR HARTNETT: So then Lancaster County would have...

SENATOR BEUTLER: Well, they would have to report them, and they couldn't give you...

SENATOR HARTNETT: They couldn't give you any...

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...anything of value, more than \$50.

SENATOR HARTNETT: So they couldn't give me two, they could give me...

SENATOR BEUTLER: Yeah, well, I mean, that gets us back to the whole question...

SENATOR HARTNETT: ...I think football tickets are...

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...of, what is the value of a University of Nebraska football ticket, too, that we're trying to...that we're trying to get away from.

SENATOR HARTNETT: (Laugh) Yeah, yeah, okay. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Hartnett. Senator Beutler, there are no further lights. Did you wish to close on your amendment?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Yeah, maybe I should just take a second and remind you that basically this was designed to be a clean-up amendment, but it was a little more complicated than we had anticipated. But, working with the exemption that says admission to a state-owned facility or a state-regulated industry or event may be given regardless of value; it's an exemption. What's the important part of what's added here is that, not only may it be given regardless of value, but it may be received or accepted regardless of value, but it has to come from the sponsoring agency, political subdivision or publicly
