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he is considering that this is something we should talk about a little bit more off the floor. But, if that's the case, I won't go into any more, except to say that I think I agree...I mean, I don't think I agree, I agree with Senator Bromm on this that we do need to make certain that we know and we clarify what we want it to be. So, with that, I will return my time to the Chair.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Schimek. Senator Coordsen, you're recognized.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you, Mr. President. Only briefly, in this particular part of the debate, I have seen samples of things that happen. There's a lunch, and the centerpieces are \$5 or \$10 worth of silk flowers, I don't know what they are, whether silk or real, and many times I have seen those just simply, at the conclusion, rather than being thrown into the trash, to be given to spouses, particularly female spouses, of senators. It would be an almost impossible thing for a member of the lobby to keep track of something of that note within the context of the aggregation. I am not in favor of gifts over \$50, and I don't mind the aggregation. My problem is, how in the world do we make it work in a way that doesn't create a problem for those that are required to comply? So that...I would close with that, but I'm just trying to think my way through, how it works...how it would work in the real world and how we could comply. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Coordsen. Senator Beutler, there are no further lights. Did you wish to close on your amendment, AM3226?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Cudaback, members of the Legislature, I appreciate what Senator Coordsen has said and others have said. And it's really difficult to think about these things, because this \$50 limitation, for example, doesn't include food and drink; so there are some things you have to add in and some things you don't. And that's why I think having a statement of value concept could be of value in many cases. In any event, this is something we have to resolve one way or another. But having said that and understanding that there will be a meeting of interested parties to hash out some of this stuff, I do believe, at this late point in the session, that things like
