one who wrote me the letter. This lobbyist had to itemize to the principal what the expenditures went for. And this lobbyist had specified Senators Higgins and Labeledz as having attended these various functions where specific amounts were expended for both of them. The only way they found out was because the principal asked them about these activities. They had not attended any of them. What the lobbyist had done was padded the account that was given to the principal, reimbursed for money not expended on these senators and pocketed. You all don't know whether some lobbyist has put your name down as having been the recipient of some money or some...whatever it is they call entertainment. And since it doesn't have to be disclosed publicly, unless the principal goes through and asks each one of you, you'll never know. Bernice and Marge, Senator Higgins and Senator Labeledz, happened to find out, through chance, how they had been used. If the lobbyists have to make that report, not only can they not put us down as having been the recipient of something which is not true, but their principal would have a way of knowing whether or not the filing was truthful. I'm not that worried about the principal, but I am worried about us and the way we can be misused. Public officials have a reputation that is not the highest in a lot of people's opinion, not necessarily because of what has been done by a specific person, but people are just mad at politicians, and in some cases justifiable so, probably. But, if there are enough reasons that we have given people to be upset with us, we should not have lobbyists creating additional problems. So when they give an aggregate amount for all the senators who were at a cattle feed, I don't want to be included in that amount. I don't want them to be able, whoever the "them" would be who would make checks of this, a total amount, divide by 49, and that's what each one of us got. I would be excluded. But I don't want to have to tell everybody I didn't go here, I didn't go there, I didn't accept this, I didn't accept that. Let the lobbyist who is giving and has a reason for giving simply make a notation that I provided so-and-so with such and such on this date. And I don't even care about eliminating the under \$5; put everything down.
