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other circumstances are equal, people are not treated in some way that would indicate that they're being treated differently when in fact they're not. We're all aware of the situations where currently there are people who look at the expenses, and out of their own, either ignorance or lack of concern for detail or what, simply take the total lobbying expenses and divide it by 49 and give credit, for an example, of Senator Chambers of some...I don't know what the figure is, \$17,000 being spent lobbying him, when we know as a fact that no money is spent, or we can assume is a fact that no money is spent on Senator Chambers. Five dollars is minutia in the year 2000. The money spent from the taxpayers keeping track of that is going to be money that's not well used and will in fact create a situation that everyone involved, I think, finally throws up their hands and says we can't do this, and just start lumping off assumptions because of the requirements to keep track. So I think that Senator Bromm did introduce this simply to raise the issue and make...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR COORDSEN: ...a point. But I have to believe that we're going the wrong direction with the reporting requirements in Senator Bromm's proposed amendment that would apply to the lobbyists. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Coordsen. Senator Bromm, there are no further lights. Did you wish to close on your amendment, Senator Bromm?

SENATOR BROMM: Thank you, Senator Cudaback and members. And I have appreciated the comments. I do think the idea in my amendment has merit. I don't think it's unworkable, but I want what we come out of here with to be, as Senator Wickersham and I were just discussing, I want it to be practical and as, this is never simple, but as clear as possible. And there is some confusion and some question about what my amendment means at this point. So, I think, rather than ask anyone to make a judgment based on confusion, if there is some of that, I will withdraw the amendment and hope that, Senator Chambers and whoever leads the discussion as it progresses, we can put this into the mix for further consideration.
