ASSISTANT CLERK: (Record vote read, Legislative Journal page 1586.) The vote is 39 ayes, 0 nays, 6 present and not voting, 4 excused and not voting, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: The bill is passed. LB 1348A.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Read LB 1348A on Final Reading.)
