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13 percent. The highways are 17 percent. Public works is 16 percent. But when we get to public health and social services, because the state, while I was a county commissioner, took over a large portion of the social services that used to be administered by the counties, in our county is less than 2 percent. Now most counties have some type of general assistance which is basically the stopgap area for people that fall through the net of the other services. Some of those are operated by the Department of Social Services, or Department of Health and Human Services, that they contract with for that small number of people. Some of those are...some of the counties, Sarpy County has one person that operates that department. So the poverty issue to me has been picked up by the state in some other fashion by taking over those social services' costs in the early eighties. I worry more about the costs to public safety, the sheriff, the jail, the courts, the juvenile court, the services of the juvenile...to juveniles in our county, diversion programs and other things. Some of those have other sources of revenue and some of those are subsidized by other state programs. But I do think that that's a significant portion of the budget. When I asked about why poverty was being used as one of the pieces of this formula, the answer I got was it was a way to determine crime in a county. And I guess my question would be, why not look at crime rates? The answer I got to that was, well, maybe people would...and the way crime rates are determined are by the number of crimes reported in a county to local law enforcement. And if we use that rate, perhaps counties would be tempted to maybe have people call in or cook the numbers or something. It might drive some manipulation there, and I realize that's a problem. And I guess all of the points that I'm trying to make here just point to my concern that if we pass this formula...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR THOMPSON: ...today, which was developed I know by the committee, I think a better process would be to use the interim study that's already been proposed by the committee to look at this issue or by...that has been introduced not necessarily by the committee, take the summer, work collaboratively with the counties. I mean, this is not, as I understand, and I'll ask Senator Wickersham to answer the question...this didn't come
