SENATOR JENSEN: Oh, I...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I'm not asking what you remember.

SENATOR JENSEN: Right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Do you think he remembers that?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: If he didn't remember it, do you think he's been made aware of it as the session has progressed or moved toward its conclusion?

SENATOR JENSEN: I would say, yes, he's been made aware of it.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Now, if a person is not happy with the Governor and is not happy with the way the Governor's henchpersons and minions have dealt with various members of the Legislature, this bill would be an ideal opportunity for that member to deliver a message to the Governor, don't you think? Whether you agree with that being done or not, don't you think that could be done?

SENATOR JENSEN: That could be done.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Do you think that a lot of work was done by the members of the committee on this bill?
