them get their education and to get the RN or whatever, and then stay in Nebraska, one way or the other. At that time, it was for them to go to the rural towns. That didn't work as well as we thought it would, but it was a help. In some ways, I think it did work. So when you go back to the scholarship thing, which I'm sure you will, you might remember that and even maybe get some of that legislation, bring that out of the archives because I think Arlene Nelson, I remember she was involved and some others who are not here. But just to go back once more to what I said, I will support your legislation and I see what all you're doing now is giving the expenses to this board, and this is going to be sunsetted. It's an interim thing, more or less, to bring some answers back to...okay, we're not really starting a new group. I have no objection to that. I just wanted to be sure I understood what was going on and the fiscal note now is fairly low. Okay. Thank you, and I just...I'll reiterate again. This past two years has brought home to me again, the nurses are the ones who...that you rely on. If you're in the hospital, a nursing home or whatever, the nurses are the ones you rely on. If you go home after surgery or whatever, but still need some help, the nurse is the one that comes. So always remember that, and I hope that...and I know that Marian Price...I think we have two nurses, don't we? Right. Someone said once the Legislature needs a nurse. Now we're really lucky, we have two. So my young doctor friend over here, no offense to the medical profession, but I know that the doctors know and understand that nurses are the ones who make the health industry hum and who work with the families as well as the patient. So thanks again, Senator Suttle. I think you're on a good track here.
