SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. And then, in the committee amendment, it references back to 13-518 with regard to the definition of what state aid means, and just tell me. I couldn't see school districts in there and I'm sure you must have covered them, but if a school district...what is state aid as far as a school district is concerned?

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: School districts have a separate set of statutes that apply to them, but state aid for school districts would be whatever...they have a separate listing of what is a...

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: ...accountable receipt for them.

SENATOR BEUTLER: There's one main state aid to...

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Yes,...

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...formula to school districts...

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: ...TEEOSA.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...and if they are not receiving state aid under that formula are they subject to the Budget Act?

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: They would have property tax.

SENATOR BEUTLER: But it says no property tax...

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Well...

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...or will not receive state aid.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Everybody gets something out of that program, I think, and, if they don't get something out of that, they get state aid. But the...but the budget provisions for schools are separate in any event. This is applicable to the other political subdivisions.
