SENATOR THOMPSON: ...questions. And having...if you've gotten your driver's license lately, at least in Sarpy County, they have a message board encouraging people to be organ and tissue donors. They have brochures and information, posters to draw people's attention to it. This law would just simplify what's in state law that they have to have on a form, and people who are interested in this can provide...pick up the information there. They have a brochure available to them. They're just kind of cutting down on the amount of paper and verbiage in the current form. I would also mention that the organ and tissue donor task force of Nebraska and the people who serve on this brought this to our attention and it probably should have been part of the bill last year and when we passed the \$1 we could have done it at that point in time and it just didn't get done...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR THOMPSON: ...and their concern...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Chambers, you may continue, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Mr. President, and I will allow Senator Thompson to continue.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Thompson.

SENATOR THOMPSON: I spoke to a group of...called "New Hearts". It's a group of transplant recipients and they brought it to my attention there this fall. I know that there's a concern from the people who work in the field, in the area, that we're not being consistent that...in our language in how we describe organ and tissue donation, and also that the verbiage in this particular point of the application process is very lengthy and it would be better to simplify it, make it clearer. With the way we talk about this now, organ and tissue donation is the language of the year 2000 rather than anatomical gifts, and they wanted this language improved. So I came to this issue from the donor group or the people who are recipients and the people who are working on organ and tissue donation and then...then the department came to me at the same time with the same issues.
