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Senator Baker kind of brought a lot of the issues out that I was going to bring out. I cannot see why this can't be located 200 miles as well as 2 blocks. I just don't understand that because with the computers nowadays and telephones and everything, communication is so much better than it was a few years back that I think it should be a real plus for the state of Nebraska. And I guess I'm still upset with the whole bill itself, because I think the counties was doing a great job collecting it and dishing it out there in each county, and now it's centrally located. I realize we was supposed to do it with the federal mandate, but I still think that was the wrong thing to do for the state of Nebraska because I think they was doing a great job, and it was something that they could do in every county. And I guess I don't know how many people is going to be needed under this Customer Service Unit and where it might get located, but I think this is a good idea and I still support it, and it's not out state. We're still in-state out there so, hopefully, that we can get something located in my area. Thank you.
