But I don't believe it would cause a problem, and I base that on several things. Recently, you know I have a 7-year old little boy and he's into these, oh, those new quarters that are out. And so I ordered those, oh, first state quarters' map and my check went to a drop box in Des Moines, Iowa. Well, it's been, I don't know, ten or twelve weeks and I haven't gotten this map yet and he keeps pestering me, where is it, where is it. So I called the 1-800 number and I'm not certain but I'm almost certain that 1-800 number was a telemarketer that was not located in Des Moines, Iowa. I mean if you look at the standard business practice, most of these companies to which money goes, insurance companies, things of this nature, the money goes to a drop box in Des Moines, Iowa, or some centralized location in the United States. And so if you have, you know your life insurance out of New York City, well, maybe your check goes to New York City, but more likely than not it goes somewhere that's closer so they can get ahold of that money quicker, get it
