votes. That's when the bill has been passed. There is some other act which constitutes approval, and the other act must be the signing of the bill by the Governor. Now I don't know if his placing or her placing a signature constitutes that approval or if the filing of the bill with the Secretary of State is the act which constitutes final approval, but at any rate it does not have to linger as long as a bill does which does not carry the emergency clause before taking effect. So, if I am successful in stripping this emergency clause, there is no need for the bill. Even if it were enacted into law, which it shall not be, but even if it were, it would not take effect until 90 days after we're out of session. Would everything be lost? Not really, because the bill would take effect 90 days after we're out of session and from that day until the expiration date, which Senator Wickersham so generously is extending to these gougers, they would have that period of time during which to make application to cheat the public, to tell the public that I do not want to pay taxes, and I realize that for every tax I do not pay someone else must pay, and the ones who are going to pay are the suckers who sent those senators down there to vote for a law so that I don't have to pay taxes and these suckers will. Senator Wickersham did not vote for this bill. If I gave that impression I need to correct that. There were a few of us who did argue against it. The bill passed anyway, so those businesspeople think that they can get whatever they please. This session their bill was delivered into my hands. The lobby is clearing because I think they know that the end is in sight. They know I'm not going to fold. They know that I'm not going to croak and they know that I will take us to the end. And you know what else I'd do by achieving that? All of those bills on the backside of this agenda are not going to be considered today. I thought this bill being at the bottom of the page was all that the Speaker had scheduled for us, but there are a few inconsequential bills on Select File that were going to be considered. That's right, brothers and sisters, turn the page and look. There are at least a half dozen bills that were to be considered today. So here's the deal, if you want to call it that. Those who have bills that they wanted considered today...
