what it is that has given up the ghost, in fact, but only temporarily. The text of that Micron bill will still be on the books. That language contains the authorization for the Legislature to take action to revive it. So it's just going into a state of rest. I wouldn't even say a coma, necessarily, but we're going to suspend its animation. And during that time, Senator Wickersham, Senator Brashear, and others who are willing to take time with these big shots and make them understand that it's in their best interest to concede certain things in terms of revealing information, reviewing the overall impact of these giveaway programs, they will have leverage because they can say we have another opportunity next session to resuscitate the bill. And you will see that you don't necessarily get every thing that you want. It'll teach them something. Everybody else's hands are clean. I'm accustomed to doing dirty work in the Legislature. I've been doing it all session, and I'll do it again...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...on this bill and I intend to continue, to continue, to continue. And in the spirit of being collegial, I'm not going to offer a reconsideration motion just yet, but if I've got 22 motions on this bill, you can multiply that by 2 because I can move to reconsider each one, but I don't want to do that tonight.
