Chamber. Senator Kristensen, Senator Matzke, Senator Dwite Pedersen, Senator Robak and Schimek, Senator Schrock, Senator Smith, Senator Thompson, Senator Tyson, Senator Quandahl, please report to the Chamber, the house is under call. CLERK: 2 ayes, 32 nays, Mr. President, on the amendment.

SENATOR CUDABACK: The Chambers amendment is not adopted. I do raise the call. Mr. Clerk, next item.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Chambers, FA372. (Legislative Journal page 1547.)

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Chambers, you're recognized to open on FA372.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Mr. President and members of the Legislature, I resorted to the gadget tonight because Micron was one of those companies that I think dealt in high tech microchips and such things as that, so it's appropriate that instead of I rel...instead of my relying on the Journal, I go to the gadget that we have on our desk. What this amendment would do is to repeal outright section 77-4901 to section 77-4935, which, in effect, would repeal all of the Micron bill; everything related to Micron. What I did while I had a minute was to look up this matter that Senator Wickersham had been discussing on the Micron bill, and I think it might be kind of appropriate here because Deacon Jones led off with an amendment, and this is what Senator Jones said at page 1369 when he was called on to discuss his amendment.
