then when we get to Select File, these bills will have to eat up some of that time. So as the bill collector says, pay me now or pay me later. Are there any others? LB 1234A, which is the appropriation bill for LB 1234. Those are the bills which are lying in wait, but bills about which nobody cares. Now some of those bills I am interested in, but they cannot mean more to me than the ones who have introduced them, so I will continue with my process. And rather than jump around and skip through this transcript, I probably should do what is always done with a good story or a good play, and that's to begin at the beginning. And were I to begin at the beginning and follow the suggestion of Senator Coordsen, people would probably think I was trying to imitate the Clerk, because the first one to speak on this bill was Senator Warner. And those who were here when Senator Warner was here, they know that he and Senator McDon...I meant Clerk Patrick O'Donnell could have run neck and neck for who was least able to be understood, so I'm not going to try to read it the way that anybody who spoke on here spoke. But Senator Warner began by saying, and I know I won't be able to finish it at this point because...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...I'm into my close. I have one minute. Well, I'll wait. It wouldn't be righteous to start reading with only one minute to go. So I think I will, in the interest of being collegial, give this time back to the Chair while I draft a motion which I shall straightaway file. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. The question before the body is the Chambers amendment FA372 to LB 1330. All in favor vote aye, opposed nay.
