I'll return my time back to the Chair. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Schmitt.

SENATOR BROWN: So the...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Chambers on the Brown amendment.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I have to ask Senator Brown a question. Senator Brown, is it your intention now to take this motion to a vote?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Brown, would you yield?

SENATOR BROWN: I would like to have some discussion about the potential of dealing with this issue in light of what we've done with the MTBE ban. But since I assume that, Senator Chambers, you are going to throw down the gauntlet about the adoption of amendments, I probably will not take this amendment to a vote. But I'd certainly like to hear some discussion on the floor about whether there is concern on anyone else's part about the kinds of things that we may be encouraging being used even more in this state, and whether it is a good idea to have that being encouraged, and whether we should let people know.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. I would like to ask Senator Raikes a question, because he knows everything.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Raikes, would you respond to a question, please?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Raikes, have you ever heard the shorthand for dynamite, or an explosive, given by the three letters T-N-T?

SENATOR RAIKES: I have, Senator.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I'm going to give you give you the first two: Tri-Nitro, and what is the third one?

SENATOR RAIKES: Toluene.
