regulations as well as the rejection of regulations, Senator, I kind of agree with you. This is...this is just what came out of the negotiating process. Logic might dictate that you put in "or adopt"...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...too, and if you are interested in making that amendment quickly I certainly would be amenable if Senator Schrock is amenable to accepting that. Your logic is certainly correct, I think, in that if you apply it in the one case you may well should apply it in the other, although none of the parties who are negotiating here seem to have either noticed or taken an interest in that distinction. So, having said that, I think I've answered or tried to answer all the questions that have been posed so far, but I certainly would invite additional questions as this is a delicate balancing act but it's certainly fair game.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Beutler. We're discussing AM3324 to LB 1234. Senator Wickersham, your light is next if you are available. Senator Beutler, Senator Wickersham is yielding his four and a half minutes to you.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Members of the Legislature, you know, I don't think there's anything else in the amendment that is unusual or would be of particular interest to you. The constitution of the board was described to you. Senator Schrock had an additional point to make, so I think I will yield to him at this particular point in time, unless Senator Wickersham wants his time back and not further subdelegated at this point.
