that and the way we recognized it in LB 806 was something that needed to be done. The situation at Winnebago, because one school district took advantage, I'm not quite sure that it has ramifications for everyone else. And in fact, although one school district took advantage, the Department of Education checked with the feds, and the feds said they qualify. So, as I understand Senator Beutler, next year, may bring something that would be a new definition in state law as to qualifications. As far as the lawsuit in Omaha, I read in the paper, as far as them...the lawsuit they may file, that seemed to me to be more along the lines against LB 299, with the levy limits, that's what they seemed to be complaining about. And as far as state aid, you know we had the lawsuit by the Class I's; at least they had come to the Legislature a number of times making their case. Omaha has never come to the Education Committee or the Revenue Committee looking for any kind of solution, if they thought they were unique and yet, as I read it, they're ready to file a lawsuit. I find that in itself unique. And so with that, thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: There are no further lights on. Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: I withdraw the amendment.

SENATOR CUDABACK: It is withdrawn. Mr. Clerk, next item.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Kristensen would move to return LR 6CA to Select File for a specific amendment. (AM3207, Legislative Journal page 1475.)

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Kristensen, to open on your motion to return to Select File.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Thank you, Mr. President. Members of the Legislature, much earlier this session we approved LR 6CA through two rounds of debate. At the time of Select File there were a couple people who did not get a chance to speak who were busy doing other things, and the matter moved quickly on Select File. So I've held the bill off or the constitutional amendment off for probably six weeks or so to give people a chance to look at it. It was not going to be on the primary; there was no need
