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note that on line 16 of the amendment there is an error. The word "nay" appears at the very end of the line. That word should obviously be "any". We will expect E & R to correct that error. I put a little "E" right beside that as an error, not wishing to clog up our system with a specific amendment to deal with that material. Then, finally, there is a provision that says, none of the information provided on the form, that is the form that's necessary to report the base information that will eventually go into a report, rather sensibly we're going to say that none of that is confidential. It's going to be reported anyway, but people have sometimes peculiar notions about confidentiality so we're going to provide that none of that is confidential. As I've indicated, this is an agreed amendment between myself and Senator Landis. I want to compliment Senator Landis on the work that he did on AM3330. It is a vast improvement over what we saw in the green copy of the bill and I think Senator Landis has been sensitive to questions that were raised by myself and a variety of others on the floor during General File debate. There are, as he indicated, some differences remaining. I don't know that those are going to be considered to be major differences. I do think we're confronted with policy issues that I'm not able to reconcile myself to, Senator Landis, with what I consider to be an ADC bill, but instead of being an Aid to Dependent Children bill I would characterize this as an aid to dependent corporations bill. So I...I don't know if you are going to be able to think of ADC as anything other than Aid to Dependent Children, but I think in the context of this bill aid to dependent corporations is more like it.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Wickersham. Senator Wickersham, your light is on. Would you like to continue? Senator Landis, on the Wickersham amendment.

SENATOR LANDIS: Well, two things. Number one, I think Bob has probably already won the rhetorical match or at least he's landed a darn good blow with that ADC crack. That was pretty good stuff. With respect to the "nay", knowing that Senator Wickersham had written the amendment I thought it was actually an intended use of the word "nay" since, in fact, its origin. But, upon reflection, "any" is exactly right and it will be taken care of by E & R and I would ask for the adoption of the
