but I would certainly urge that we not pass this bill (sic-amendment). It really isn't fair to the other people who have pulled their individual amendments to allow the passage of LB 1115 and so I would just urge that Senator Kiel either pull the bill (sic--amendment) or we vote red.

SENATOR CUDABACK: There are no further lights on, Senator Kiel.

SENATOR KIEL: Senator Cudaback, members of the Legislature, as a charter member of the "Uppity Women's Club" of Nebraska, I thought it was important that we...that we bring this amendment so that, you know, we could talk about things that I think probably are important to pass this year. I understand, of course, that a lot of other senators have agreed to pull their amendments to ensure that LB 1115 gets passed this year and I think it's important to make a point that there are...there are things that will not pass this year that are needed and this is one of them. And, of course, with that said, I will also...I also say this is no way to run a railroad and I withdraw the amendment.
