SENATOR TYSON: Which...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: So, if you...

SENATOR TYSON: Well, in the definition of the relatives, Senator, it says that for an individual...for not less than ten years prior to receipt of a gift or loan has stood...in other words, I have to be married ten years before I can get a gift...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: No,...

SENATOR TYSON: ...from my wife.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...no, Senator.

SENATOR TYSON: That's what it says.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: I think I...I just tried to explain. All these others up here are...spouse, father, all of those, and then...all of those are relatives. And then also a relative is someone who has, for one reason or another, been ten years in that domestic household, whether it's a child who was never
