when you've got "y" amount of money for a campaign contribution? That's a tough question, one that we would rather not have asked of us, but that's the best, strongest way of dealing in this area and it has to do with disclosing campaign contributions and then being accountable for them in the public arena, not by establishing a standard that says it's okay to accept \$48 or \$50 for six months, but the seventh month you do it, it's wrong. Should we just have a \$25 a month standard and make that year-round? Or should we have a \$50 standard...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Time.

SENATOR LANDIS: ...so that you can then trip over that on the seventh month? Get out of town. Reconsider.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Landis. Senator Kremer.

SENATOR KREMER: Thank you, Mr. Lieutenant Governor. I'd like to call the question.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: I don't believe there's been sufficient debate yet. Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. Lieutenant Governor, members of the Legislature, let me remind you also, in light of some of the...the concept of acceptance, that it continues to be reiterated here on this motion to reconsider. This amendment had nothing to do with acceptance. Remember, it didn't amend that side of the law that says that you can't accept. You can accept as much as you could before we ever had LB 1021. It doesn't change that at all over the period of a year. What it does say on the lobbyist side is that they cannot give, and so it doesn't require any reporting on our part or any keeping track on our part; it does on the part of the lobby. Senator Landis doesn't like any laws that are not just pure disclosure laws. If you think that disclosure is the only answer there should be in this area of the law, then you would want to vote with Senator Landis. But if you think that there is some value to limitations to setting out our idea of what a good legislator should or should not do, then you will not want to vote with Senator Landis. Senator Landis would say that the \$50 limitation is ridiculous. He shakes his head "yes". He would
