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one for the guest that is reportable.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: No, not from the sponsoring agent...entity for the event.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: But under the Schimek amendment I think it is, that you will have to report that one.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: You are correct, Senator Kristensen.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: So the Regents won't report their one but the legislators will report their one.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: That's right.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Okay. And that's the reason I'm trying to...I'm trying to find...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: ...I'm trying to find lines of logic that are out there.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: You're being very...and the thought process, if you're interested, very specifically, Regents might well be expected to attend that event. They are part of the governing board of the agency that's holding the event.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: And I think that that's...that's good policy. This doesn't limit them, if they want to get...if the university wanted to give them ten sets, they're not prohibited from the ten sets. They would just have to report those. Is that correct?

SENATOR BRASHEAR: They'd have to report eight.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Okay. And that I don't have a...

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Because, as it is now, they do not have to report it at all.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Right, and I don't think that's...that's
