SENATOR BRASHEAR: Mr. President, members of the body, discussions over the noon recess have resulted in an effort to further simplify and now all we would be doing with the amendment before you is to basically make it applicable to officials in...the current language provides for...that it's appro...that it applies to officials in the executive branch and officials in the legislative branch. You've heard me discuss that distinction before and particularly as it relates to public officials. Now we would utilize the public official definition which would specifically cover state officials, including those who are on the governing boards of postsecondary educational institutions. And that's what the amendment does. As it relates to the discussion had before the lunch hour, when Senator Kristensen and I were talking about which tickets are reportable and not reportable, it now goes with the bill, the format of the bill as you have all agreed on it to this point in time. And all tickets can be accepted, all tickets are reportable. I would urge the adoption of the amendment. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Brashear. We are now open for discussion on the Brashear amendment, AM3365, to AM3321, the Schimek amendment, open for discussion. Seeing no discussion, Senator Brashear, did you wish to close?

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Simply urge the adoption of the amendment to the amendment, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: The question before the body is, shall the Brashear amendment, AM3365, be amended to AM3321, the Schimek amendment, to LB 1021? All those in favor of the question vote aye, opposed nay. We are voting on the Brashear amendment, AM3365, to the Schimek amendment, AM3321. Have you all voted who care to? Record, please, Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 29 ayes, 2 nays on the adoption of Senator Brashear's amendment to the amendment, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: The Brashear amendment is adopted. Mr. Clerk, next item.
