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think that's an inappropriate standard. It does include a few folks, so...and it is people that I think you would normally consider to be your family and expect to deal with them in a family relationship. So, Senator Coordsen, thank you, I think that's a much better approach than where we were going with our list.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Wickersham. (Visitors introduced.) Now we're open on discussion on the Coordsen amendment, FA402 (sic--FA403), to AM3321. Seeing no lights, Senator Coordsen. Senator Coordsen waives closing. Did you wish to close?

SENATOR COORDSEN: I...I...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Excuse me, Senator Coordsen.

SENATOR COORDSEN: I think perhaps, given the complexity of LB 1021 and how this has an impact on everyone, I ought to. As Senator Wickersham did indicate, this definition comes, to a certain extent, out of our inheritance statutes, where there is a number of...of decisions made or alignments made of relatives. But for your purposes, the third degree of "consequity" are people who share mutually great-grandparents. So I think we have covered the bases to the extent that is necessary in the provision of excluding gifts from people...of family members. So, with that, I would again encourage the adoption of this amendment.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Coordsen. The question before the body is, shall amendment, FA403, be adopted to AM3321? All those in favor of the question vote aye, opposed nay. We are voting on the Coordsen amendment. Have you all voted who care to? Record, please, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 31 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Coordsen's amendment.

SENATOR CUDABACK: The Coordsen amendment is adopted.

CLERK: I have nothing further pending to Senator Schimek's amendment.
