interstate is regulated by the federal government, and the carrying out of that authority is through the state only. So they can put those signs up now in municipalities and where they choose to. We're not dealing with that. This is only the interstate.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Schrock. Senator Vrtiska, on the Preister amendment to LB 1361.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Thank you, Senator Cudaback. Senator Preister, a question, please.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Preister, would you respond, please?

SENATOR PREISTER: Yes, I will.

SENATOR VRTISKA: I think you indicated that these...this is a statute that could come into play, but the city would still have to pass an ordinance to enact this. Is that correct?

SENATOR PREISTER: That's correct, Senator Vrtiska. This just authorizes them to then go through their procedures, have a public hearing, I assume, and go through that process.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Okay. And you did say that the main concern here is noise. Is that correct?

SENATOR PREISTER: That is correct, Senator Vrtiska.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Well, you know, the biggest complaint that I get...and I say this with some hesitation, with the young people up here...the biggest...people are irritated...are the most irritated about boom boxes. Can you throw boom boxes into this equation and put a stop to that noise? I've had people call me. They're just really disturbed about these automobiles that drive up and down the streets of town with these things playing, where I don't understand how they can even hear one another think. But I'm just curious if we can pass a law that says they can't use...if it's just strictly for noise, can't we add that into it and allow them to pass a regulation or a rule that they can't? Or can they do it already?
