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of us not returning, and asking what regrets we had, and I said, well, one of my biggest regrets is not being able to do anything about the (laugh) homestead exemption law for disabled people. And so that is a regret that I have. But a far greater regret is looking at what happened to people who read this as it...as they would think it would have been clearly stated, and certainly what I've stated about how a department interprets something I think in direct opposition to what...how the bill is stated. However, on April 10th of this session, if we adopt the Bourne amendment, it would certainly help my constituent and the people who read this this way. I do think it has a significant A bill. I can't say the exact amount, Senator Bourne. The bill I introduced this year was \$5 million, and Senator Wickersham correctly stated the one two years ago, I remember being surprised when I got that. So I'm not sure anyone really knows. We get into who qualifies, who doesn't qualify and I'm not sure that we...we've settled that. And so, it's a...as I've said before, I think it's a tragic situation. I asked Legal Counsel to the Revenue Committee if the families could file a claim with the Business and Labor Committee next year on this issue, because...and they said, anyone can bring a claim to the Business and Labor Committee, until we finally sort this out. I just...I'm hesitant to think that on this late date that we can. If this goes on too much longer, I assume this could be pulled from the agenda, and then that would mean, I guess, that "or" would stay in place. And I'm seeing you smiling, maybe that's all of your intent, but I would imagine with this floor debate that would strengthen the case for the people who feel that they might qualify for this exemption. I just...you would have to make a more convincing argument that at this time, at this time of the session that we could do something. And, Senator Hilgert, just because \$23 million was vetoed out doesn't mean that we can just go spend \$23 million (laugh) away. The reason it's vetoed out is, if we look at the out years and where we're going to be, we have to meet some budget restraints. And so I think that, as much as all of us would like to react and react favorably, that at this time I'm not sure it would be responsible on our part to change it. And, Senator Bourne, if we don't...if your amendment doesn't pass, I assume that you will be back, I know you'll be back next year, I'm hoping, and Senator Hilgert and other people who are interested in this. And I do think the bill presented this year to the Revenue
