applying for this. You know, if we...if that would have been the case, I'm sure we would have heard about it. That's not the case. I don't believe that there's any huge A bill on this. I mean, certainly, perhaps some other people could qualify for it, I don't know. But what this is, these are disabled poor people because, remember, the homestead exemption program has income levels in there. These are not disabled rich folks, or rich folks alone. These are disabled poor people who are getting a little bit of a tax break so they can stay in their house. My amendment simply maintains the way the law is today that went into place on January 1st of the year 2000 that we passed last year in the form of LB 179 and the Governor signed. I would really urge your adoption of this amendment to Wickersham's amendment. Thank you.
