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would play the same games as any other video slot machine. Not true. Any other video slot machine is not tied into the Department of Revenue. With these kind of machines, the Department of Revenue can keep exact records on during time of day, what winners exist, and what in fact and when that machine has used up the allotment of video pickle cards. I have no problem with people arguing the evils of gambling, I really do, I have no problem with that and I'm sure there are some of you who would vote against whatever bill we have on the floor if it involves gambling and I understand that. I don't gamble and that's not important. I wouldn't do a lot to support this kind or any kind of gambling. I think I had lunch once across the river. To be completely frank, in Nebraska we have all of the problems that go along with gambling because of the access across the river. But we don't have the revenues to help resolve and take care of those problems. And I think you ought to know it's a policy of people like those gambling organizations from across the river in Iowa that they do everything they can to keep any kind of gambling away from anywhere nearby, some I hear 150 miles, in some cases I hear 500. But, as you'll know, some of these gambling organizations are clustered in a particular area and there's very few, if any, other organizations around them unless they existed before that conglomerate and organization started, as they are over in Council Bluffs. I also understand they're not above hiring people and calling themselves somebody against gambling, for example. By the way, first of all I want to say this has nothing to do with Jim Jensen. He's an honest true believer and I have no problem with whatever he does or whatever he says or any amendments he might offer, because he believes. But I have some serious problems with some of these people that pass out documents like this, Nebraskans Against Expanded Gambling, signed by Ally Milder. I understand her salary is \$36,000 a year. It would be nice to be able to find out where organizations like this get their money. The organization that beat the judge here not too recently, the Supreme Court judge in Nebraska, we couldn't find out where their money come from, did we? We talked about accountability and disclosure, right, just recently so that we could be honest about where our money comes from, and it shouldn't just have to do with elected officials. It should have to do with organizations that fight even though it appears to be a group of people who have honest and
