offense having an illegal gambling device in their establishment, and they would lose it on the second offense. They would lose their license, so I think we are trying to work against illegal gambling in this state, which is, I think, probably the illegal gambling is probably one of the biggest causes for compulsive gambling in the state of Nebraska, along with the legal gaming that is across our borders on every side, east, west, north and south. So with illegal gambling and with the casino type gambling is causing most of the problems. You never really heard too much about compulsive gambling until that started and we, of course, we decided not to allow casino gambling on the Indian reservations in Nebraska. So I guess we're not going to be able to blame the Indians for that this year anyway. But I just want you to know that there have been steps taken to curtail illegal gambling in liquor establishments this year. And, as Senator Robak indicated that, just so we know where these funds are coming from, I probably will support Senator Smith's amendment, but I want you to know where the money is coming from. It's needed. We heard this in committee. There is a problem. People have all kinds of addictions, and gambling is one that is probably more prevalent than anything else. We have people who are addicted to alcohol. We have people who are addicted to tobacco. That's just the way our society is, and if you can't...if you didn't have the keno and the pickle tickets and those types of gaming, I still think you'd have addiction because of our proximity to the large gambling casinos that are bordering us on every side. We aren't isolated. There is no spot in this state that's isolated from casino type gambling. Those casinos are smart. They'll send buses down, pick...they pick on the older people the most, give them \$5, and take them up and give them lunch, and they'll lose 20 or 30 dollars, you know. They can...they can pay for that bus ride awfully fast. So, no, we're not isolated in this state. We never will be and it's getting worse all the time. With that, that's just a few things that I wanted to mention to you while we're on this subject. Thank you.
