PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Lynch.

SENATOR LYNCH: (Singing) Red sails in the sunset, way out on the sea, good luck on the ocean, stay safe on the seas. Thanks, Jack and Norma.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Lynch. The question is the adoption of LR 367. Those in favor vote aye; those opposed vote nay. Mr. Clerk, please record.

CLERK: 46 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of LR 367.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: The resolution is agreed to. Members, the doughnuts you are getting this morning are in honor of Senator Janssen, in honor of Ray and Nancy's fortieth wedding anniversary. Senator Janssen, congratulations. Members, we will proceed to Final Reading. Mr. Clerk, LB 26.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Bromm would move to return the bill for purposes of striking the enacting clause.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Bromm, recognized to open on your motion to return LB 26 to Select File.

SENATOR BROMM: Thank you, Lieutenant Governor, and I intend to make a few brief comments and leave the motion up there for just a very few minutes, if Senator Lynch or anyone wishes to comment. And a couple of the reasons that I put the motion up, it seemed like LB 26 moved pretty quickly through the system here at the end of the session and that's the way it happens when...when we have an opening and some bills can move, and that's fine. But we did not have a tremendous amount of debate, although I think most of the points that could be made and should be made were, but I wanted to reiterate a couple of my concerns. It is...it is not easy to be...to be opposed to any bill that states as its objective to give small kids a better start on their day and a breakfast, so I don't do this lightly at all. I wouldn't do it at all if I didn't feel that I had...had an obligation to do so. I think we need to recognize
